Passing EFCA would be the straw that breaks its back.

With the nation's unemployment rate hovering around 10%, the last thing America needs is special interest legislation pending in Congress that will cost more Americans their jobs.

According to a study by noted economist Anne Layne Farrar, the Employee Free Choice Act (EFCA) - more aptly titled The Employee "Forced" Choice Act - will cost American workers 600,000 jobs in the first year. The economic report further concludes that the Employee "Forced" Choice Act, would lead to similar job cuts in subsequent years.
