Dear Representative:

On behalf of the millions of American businesses concerned with the current economic environment and the need for balance in federal regulation, the Coalition for a Democratic Workplace (CDW) urges you to support H.R. 1120, the Preventing Greater Uncertainty in Labor-Management Relations Act. Congress needs to immediately pass this much-needed legislation. The bill will provide clarity for those facing uncertainty created by the January 2012 unconstitutional recess appointments to the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB), while preserving the agency's essential functions, such as the workers' ability to petition for union elections and the ability of the NLRB regional offices to accept and process unfair labor practice charges.

CDW is a broad-based coalition of over 600 organizations united in opposition to the tenets of the socalled "Employee Free Choice Act" (EFCA), as well as EFCA alternatives that pose a similar threat to workers, businesses and the American economy. In recent years, the NLRB has attempted to enact many EFCA-like policies through administrative rulings and regulations. In response, much of CDW's focus has been directed toward the NLRB.

On Jan. 4, 2012, President Obama recess appointed three members to the NLRB when the Senate was in session. Several legal challenges were filed against the appointments, including *Noel Canning v. NLRB*, in which CDW was involved. On Jan. 25, 2013, a three-member panel of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit unanimously nullified the president's appointments, finding them unconstitutional.

Neither the administration nor the NLRB itself has taken any meaningful steps to demonstrate restraint in the wake of the D.C. Circuit ruling. In fact, last month the White House re-nominated the controversial "recess" appointees to the NLRB, and Board Chairman Mark Pearce announced following the *Noel Canning* decision that the Board "will continue to perform [its] statutory duties and issue decisions." These actions have exacerbated the uncertainty for employees, employers and unions created by the recess appointments. As a result, the agency's ability to enforce the nation's labor laws and promote industrial stability is in doubt.

While a handful of specific D.C. Circuit cases have been suspended pending Supreme Court review of the *Noel Canning* case, the fates of most decisions issued in the past year remain unclear. This uncertainty imposes real costs and additional layers of litigation on employers and other parties involved in pending NLRB actions.

H.R. 1120 would impose much-needed restraint over the NLRB's unconstitutional quorum by preventing it from issuing further decisions. In addition, the bill immediately ceases enforcement of the invalid Board's previous decisions, and ensures that such cases will be reviewed and approved by a legitimate

panel as soon as one is seated. The legislation preserves workers' ability to petition for union elections, and NLRB regional offices' ability to accept and process unfair labor practice charges. Most importantly, the restrictions H.R. 1120 places on the Board are to be removed as soon as the Supreme Court rules in the *Noel Canning* case, or the Senate confirms a quorum.

Again, CDW urges the immediate passage of H.R. 1120, the Preventing Greater Uncertainty in Labor-Management Relations Act.
